Aesthetic recovery under a Microscope

It goes without saying that not only functionality but also aesthetics are important when performing anterior tooth restoration treatment.

The esthetics of the anterior teeth are considered to be the harmony with the facial features including the lips, and the shape and color tone of individual teeth. In recent years, the harmony between gums and teeth has also been emphasized, and the reconstruction of interdental papillae has become necessary.

However, surgical interdental papilla reconstruction has been said to be difficult. However, we believe that it is possible to reconstruct the interdental papilla if the surgical procedure and anatomical rules are followed.

This time, in a patient with periodontal disease who had collapsed posterior teeth and flared out anterior teeth, implants were placed to establish a vertical stop, orthodontic treatment was performed to improve the tooth position, and papilla reconstruction was performed on the interdental papillae of the anterior teeth. Here we present a case of aesthetic restoration.
